Best wishes for 2015!

We had a very exciting year. The museum events in different countries were very interesting, we tried to cover some of them on our web site. The highlight of our ICLM year was the ICLM Annual Conference in Irkutsk and on Lake Baikal (Siberia, Russia) on July 26–31, 2014. It was a great success. I thank everyone for coming and participating. I would like to remind you to send me your papers for our Book of Proceedings of the Irkutsk Conference. Many thanks to those authors who have already done so.

I am happy to confirm that our next annual Conference will take place on September 25–29th, 2015 at the National Literary Museum of Georgia in Tbilisi (Republic of Georgia). We have scheduled the Conference for late September to coincide with the Georgian grape harvest festivities.

The Ministry of Culture of Georgia together with ICOM Georgia will cover all hotel, meals, transportation within Georgia and post conference cultural programme expenses.

The registration fee will be 270 euro for ICLM members and 300 euro for non-members. In February we will inform you of the bank account number to which to transfer our registration fees.

Please let me know as soon as possible whether you will participate in the 2015 ICLM Conference. Some members have already done so but not all. We really need this preliminary information for our Georgian hosts to develop the Conference budget and for booking the hotels and buses.

The conference will include an hour and a half round table discussion of our definition of what constitutes a “**Literary Museum**” open to all participants. This was prompted by a recent inquiry from a graduate student working on the thesis. To be up to date this subject should be revisited from time to time.

Our Conference theme will be “**Literature, Music, and Cultural Heritage**”. It gives the opportunity to touch on different aspects of our museums activities. Please send your applications to participate with a paper to Dr. Galina Alekseeva (gala@tgk.tolstoy.ru) and to Dr. Bernhard Lauer (grimmnet@t-online.de) The dead line for your applications to present a paper is July 31st, 2015.

THE 2014 ICLM CONFERENCE IN IRKUTSK AND LAKE BAIKAL IN SIBERIA

I was very much looking forward to this Conference especially as it meant a second visit of the Decembrist Museum in Irkutsk, this time with my daughter Elena Kotchoubey. I had visited there for the first time in 2013 with my son Alexander Kotchoubey.

Having been asked to give the keynote address I was a bit apprehensive of how my speech about my great grandfather Prince Sergei G. Volkonsky would be received by such a distinguished academic audience made up of learned representatives of the literary and composers museums represented. I had prepared too much material and had to mercilessly slash this material in order to be just ten minutes over the allotted time. In addition I expected that the majority of the audience would not be familiar with the subject matter. It turned out that almost everyone knew something about the Decembrists. Unfortunately due to technical problems I was not able to display any of the photos of beautiful early 19th Century portraits of my ancestors and their contemporaries.

The Conference sessions in the Irkutsk and Baikal View Hotels were very highly professional and academic. The highlights in Irkutsk were a tour of the city and a visit to and a concert in the Prince Volkonsky House of the Decembrist Museum, the last residence of my great great grandparents during their 30 year exile in Siberia. We even got a chance to briefly visit the Prince Troubetzkoy House of the Museum. Our stay in Irkutsk was followed by our stay on the spectacular Olkhon Island in Lake Baikal and our visit to the Buryat Museum in Ust Orda on our return to Irkutsk. We enjoyed beautiful weather throughout.

The boat trip to the Island was memorable as we all developed great comradery as we comfortably took in the great beauty of the nature surrounding us. These forty intrepid sailors landed on the island in good spirits and in a jovial mood which culminated in the last evening's open air picnic/barbecue with delicious food, plenty of liquid refreshments, stimulating conversation, choral and solo singing as well as dancing. Perhaps the beauti-

ful clean but ice cold waters of Lake Baikal which many of us dipped into must have kept the revelrie under control. It is said that a dip in Lake Baikal adds five years to your life. Special thanks go to Dr. Galina Alekseeva, ICLM President and to her Board members Bernhard Lauer, Maria Gregorio and Vesna Delic Gozze for organizing and running such a successful Conference, to the authorities of Irkutsk for making this possible, to Dr. Vitaly Baryshnikov, the Minister of Culture and Archives of the Irkutsk Region and his assistants as well as to Elena Dobrynina, the Director, to Ol'ga Akulich, the Assistant Director and to Sergey Murzin, the Head of the Museum's Public Relations, all of whom were always there with us to make sure our conference was successful. We will always remember and cherish their hospitality.

It is a very big pleasure to hold the International Committee for Literary and Composers' Museums (ICLM-ICOM) Annual Conference in Tbilisi, Georgia, on September 25–29, 2015.

I'm sure that the conference will be very interesting, successful and useful for all participants and attendees. From our side we will do our best for the corresponding organization of the conference and for your comfortable being in Georgia.

This is the information about the museums you will visit in Tbilisi: The Georgian National Museum; The Simon Janashia Museum of Georgia and National Gallery (permanent exhibition of Niko Pirosmani and other Georgian artists); The Giorgi Leonidze State Museum of Georgian Literature, The Georgian State Museum of Theatre, Music, Cinema and Choreograph, The State Museum of Georgian Folk Songs and Musical Instruments, The Georgian State Museum of Folk and Applied Art etc.

The Post Conference Tour will take place in the Kakheti Region and will include several stops:

The Aleksandre Chavchavadze House Museum in Tsinandali – Tsinandali is one of the most remarkable country estates in Kakheti. Tsinandali refers to four different phenomena: the estate of Tsinandali, the village of Tsinandali, Chavchavadze's summer home and several vintages of white wine. Initially built during the 19th century, the house, winery and gardens tell the story of the fascinating Chavchavadze family. The historical home of Alexandre Chavchavadze (1786–1846) and his family, is one of Georgia's most important cultural sites. http://www.tsinandali.com/index_en.html

Qvevri and The Qvevri Wine Museum – is located in the village Napareuli. Museum guests can participate in activities like: Visiting old and new types of cellars, Participating in grape harvesting, Pressing grapes in 18th century Satsnakheli (ancient facility for pressing grapes), Shoti Bread baking, Making Churchkheles (candies originating from Georgia; its components are the grape must, nuts and flour), "Zavodi" – making vodka, Opening qvevri, Visiting Qvevri museum, Hotel accommodation (12 suits)

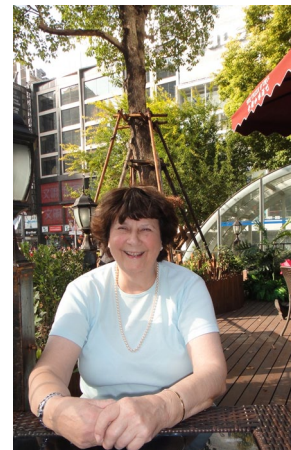

Gerd Aarsland Rosander (1934–2014)

She joined ICLM while she was building up and being the director at the Henrik Ibsen Museum in Oslo. Before the work at the Ibsen Museum – where she ended her professional career – she worked for many years at The Norwegian Folk Museum in Oslo.

She was an extremely engaged person, and she went into all kind of challenges with great energy and efficiency. She contributed at all our conferences with papers and in our discussions. But most of all – thanks to her, we could make wonderful conferences several times in Norway and Sweden. She organized everything – themes, places to be, people to contribute, money for support etc.

I was very saddened to learn about our Gerd Rosander's passing. She was one of the brightest lights in my more than 10 years experience with ICOM. I cherished our friendship and always admired her as the most wonderful person and a professional at the highest level. And the conferences also gave her the opportunity to explore and see new places and meet people where they lived.

I first met Gerd Rosander in Prague in 1996. It was the last but one of Committee meetings I had attended and one of the first Gerd did. She had recently lost her husband and was deeply mourning and next to despair. She talked to me, a stranger to her then, about her husband, about their life together and about what he had meant to her, about their hopes and wishes. Never before had I ever listened to a most warm, most frank and genuinely human talk as this one was. We became friends.

The last Committee meeting I attended was the one done in Norway in 2000, hosted by her representing the Oslo Ibsen Museum and Erling Dahl of the Bergen Grieg Museum. The meeting was excellently organized and one of the great events that taught participants how near literary and music museums actually are and what

joint efforts on an international level could mean for them and for a new structure of the Committee then envisaged. Gerd proved to be a wonderful host, her approaches to the projects the meeting's agenda offered were professional, well-considered, amazing in each and every respect.

The way we first met was extraordinary and so was the official course I later learned she was inclined to follow in her Committee work to further its purposes.

The deeply human and the highly professional – thinking of her now that she is dead I can only think of both as an inseparable unit, the way it should be with us museum people. That is, at least, what she had taught me.
