Dear colleagues, dear friends,

the highlight of the ICLM year 2011 was the wonderful conference on **Literature and Music** in Italy, in the year of the 150th anniversary of this country (see the report on p. 2). Be it the programme, the people, hosts and colleagues, the spirit of the place of Chiaravalle, or the landscape of the region Marche, 81 participants found their way to this meeting. On the average the number of participants has been growing in the last years from one conference to the other. We can take this as a sign for the success of ICLM. But it certainly brings challenges to our hosts and the organizers, and it requires a delicate balance of fees and funding. The same goes for the Proceedings. The Board was happy to present during this meeting the Proceedings of the ICLM Annual Conference in Budapest, Hungary (see p. 4). For this publication the engagement of the Petőfi Irodalmi Múzeum and our colleagues Csilla E. Csorba and Gabriella Gulyás was necessary and helpful.

It was the conference in Budapest 2009 when the encounter with our colleagues from China started. The ICOM General Conference and ICLM Conference 2010 were important catalysts for the development of a continual cooperation. Italy 2011 was one step into that direction. ICLM is pleased that the structure of our participants' lists is going to change beyond Europe.

Another success was the **International Museum Day 2011** with its motto **Museums and Memory** proposed by ICLM, and prepared by a workshop we had initiated and co-organized in 2010. One outcome of this workshop had been that not only the UNESCO Memory of the World Programme, but NGOs like ICA, CCAAA, IFLA, and ICOMOS were partners of the International Museum Day 2011.

We are working for an official change of the committee's name. Still it is: International Committee for Literary Museums. But in the future it may be: International Committee for Literary and Composer Museums, as such a change was the wish of our last general meeting.

Whether that will be effective in our next **Annual Conference 2012?** We will see. It will take place in **Oslo, Norway, from 17-20 June,** 2012 (see p. 3). You are all welcome to experience and reflect the **Spirit of the Place** (which is as well the subject of our conference)!

ICLM's 2011 Annual Conference in Italy

A report by Lothar Jordan

For its Annual Conference 2011, ICLM went once again to Italy. Like in 2008, it was Maria Gregorio who built the bridge between ICLM and Italy, but this time it was not Tuscany, but Marche region that waited on the Italian side of the bridge, and the hosts were the Fondazione Chiaravalle Montessori, furthermore the Associazione nazionale Case della memoria (with its President Adriano Rigoli). The conference was supported by the Regione Marche, the Provincia di Ancona, the Commune di Chiaravalle, and ICOM Italy. The very effective, but very friendly organization lay in the hands of Lucio Lombardi, General Director, and his team, just to mention Maila Morresi and Patrizia Giombini.

81 participants from Europe, China and Azerbaijan came to Senigallia and Chiaravalle (near Ancona) where the conference took place in the impressive Teatro Valle Chiaravalle, and they came to $\boldsymbol{Literature}$ and $\boldsymbol{Mu-}$ sic: This subject of ICLM's Annual Conference 2011 joined the two foci of the committee: ICLM, the International Committee for Literary (and Composer Museums) in ICOM. But much more, this conference connected its subject with the heart of Italian culture, and thus with an essential part of European and of world culture. And this subject seemed especially apt in 2011, when the 150th anniversary of Italy was celebrated. The long history of the interaction of literature and music got a new intensity in the 19th century as well by romantic literature as by the highlights of the opera. Reminding of Manzoni,

Leopardi, and Verdi, opens the field of culture and of politics, as they were protagonists in the struggle for creating a public consciousness of Italia through literature, language and music, and were a part of the Risorgimento, aiming at the creation of an Italian national state which succeeded in 1861.

The Conference worked for a better understanding of the relation between literature and music not only in Italy, but in the tradition and cultural practice of our members and partners, museums and similar memory institutions. After the keynote speech by musicologist and journalist Oreste Bossini, 17 papers were given to fulfill this task. It was interesting to see how often politics and history intermingled with the connection between literature and music, as Alexander Sholokhov showed through the example of US-singer Pete Seeger's anti-war song "Where have all the flowers gone", inspired by some lines of Michail A. Sholokhov's novel "And quiet flows the Don", or Fu Guangming (China) with his paper on the history of Beethoven's reception by Chinese writers up to our times.

Visits to different museums in different places of the region — all fitting elegantly to the subject of the conference — gave wonderful impressions of care for culture like in Maiolati Spontini or in Leopardi's Recanati. But it was the combination of literature and music in wonderful concerts, given for the participants

of the conference, that brought its idea to mind and senses, as the piano concert given by Maestro Gregorio Nardi who runs a museum himself in Florence, He chose music from Italian composers and composers that were 'present' through the participation of ICLM members that work for museums dedicated to these composers. Or the opera concert, given by the municipality of Chiaravalle, and wonderfully performed by the Gruppo Lirico Vocale Ancona, and the very specific concert in Senigallia with historical mechanical music instruments, guided by the hands of Franco Severi, playing marches and anthems of the Italian Risorgimento.

As Chiaravalle is the birthplace of famous educator Maria Montessori, this was a part of the conference, f.e. concerning the reflection for the use of music for education purposes. And the participants visited the Montessori library and museum in this town. After the formal ending of the conference an excursion day included visits to Pesaro with the Rossini house and to the beautifully situated old university town of Urbino, a UNESCO world heritage site.

This conference intensified the cooperation between ICLM, ICOM Italy and the Italian literary museums and houses in the Associazione Casa della Memoria. ICLM wants to publish the Proceedings of the conference in 2012, in cooperation with the Fondazione Chiaravalle Montessori, a strong and amiable partner of this meeting.
